It's hard to believe we are approaching the end of 2015! For the Red Bank Public Library it has been a really busy and wonderful year. Just a few of the things we have managed to achieve: we created some cutting edge programs, we increased our Spanish language programs, we introduced hundreds of children to the joy of reading and hearing a story, we expanded our online presence, and we expanded our hours to 38 per week. This is a huge achievement since we have accomplished all this with a reduced number of staff.

We also started a major Strategic Planning effort. In September we asked for input from the community in the form of a survey. We received over 400 responses. Thank you very much to all who helped by taking the time to fill out the survey - we are very grateful. There were some wonderful comments and suggestions which we are in the process of compiling so we can share the results.

We want to open more hours as much as people want us to extend our hours. But we will do it carefully, so we can maintain consistent hours for the future. We also want to offer more programs - authors, health, retirement, local history. We want to provide more technology classes and encourage use of our online music, movies, magazines and classes - available to everyone who has a library card! (See p. 2 - Online Offerings)

No one would dispute that one of the most appealing aspects of the Red Bank Public Library is its river views. And while many patrons enjoy spending time here, our website provides access to music, film, magazines, online courses, electronic databases, and ebooks without having to actually visit the Library. All you need is your library card number and your PIN.

Visit <a href="www.redbanklibrary.org">www.redbanklibrary.org</a> and click on <a href="Virtual">Virtual</a>
<a href="Branch">Branch</a> to take advantage of <a href="Freading">Freading</a>, an online service that allows cardholders to download ebooks for free. By clicking on the <a href="Freading">Freading</a> icon in the <a href="Virtual Branch">Virtual Branch</a>, hundreds of titles appear that include Lonely Planet Destination Guides, popular fiction, cookbooks, self-help books and much more.

There are even SAT and SparkNotes study guides for test preparation. Each icon is a link to a book description.

**Freading** ebook service is compatible with many popular devices. Any Windows or MAC computer or laptop with Internet Explorer,

Safari, Firefox or Chrome browsers will download Adobe Digital Edition software. Free Apps are available for Apple and most Android tablets or phones. Instructions are on the **Freading** website. After logging on with your library card number and your PIN, you may select ebooks to download. Lending is limited to two weeks with an option to renew. Give it a try and see how you like it!

those years, in addition to taking care of her elderly mother, and enduring ongoing treatments, she continued to read, complete the NY Times crossword puzzle in record time, and volunteer at all the Friends events, big or small, right up to our recent "What's In Your Attic?" event in October. Her fresh floral arrangements were legendary!

On December 8th, a celebration of her life was held at the Red Bank Public Library for her family and friends. It was a special time of remembrance. She was a friend to the Library in so very many ways, and she will be missed.
