And we are planning much more in 2017 which is our 80th anniversary year, including new initiatives, additional hours, enhanced digital offerings, and many engaging programs for adults, children and families. 2016 Annual Appeal

The Foundation for the Red Bank Public Library has just sent out the 2016 Annual Appeal letter. This is the third appeal the Foundation has sent to the Red Bank Community. The money raised by this appeal is unrestricted, unless otherwise specified, and will enable the Foundation to fund many initiatives. For example, proceeds from the 2015 Annual Appeal were used to purchase equipment for a new Mobile Maker Space. Importantly, this new equipment will be used to prepare promotional material and enhance programming for special Library events such as NJ Makers Day on March 25th. Also, the funds were devoted to enrich Children's Room programming and purchase necessary equipment, including updated scanners and color copi-

The current 2016 Annual Appeal emphasizes the value of Library patronage reported by individuals who routinely use its services. In conjunction with the Library's first formal Strategic Plan (2016), the findings of an extensive public survey revealed that patrons were most impressed by the value of the Library to the greater Red Bank community, the feeling of kinship among patrons that it inspires, the opportunity for individual enrichment that it affords, and the sense of tranquility that is derived from its beautiful location. This year's appeal reminds potential gift givers about these benefits. According to the Strategic Plan, proceeds from this year's appeal will be devoted to sustaining and growing the History Room, the Children's Room, and the Library's outdoor grounds. Developments in these areas will be highlighted throughout 2017 during which the Library will celebrate its 80th anniversary as the Eisner Memorial Library.

Adult Programs

The **Artists' Workshop** meets the first Thursday of every month from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. Devote time to your art with the guidance of Joe Bergholm, Artist-in-Residence. All media except oils, please.

English as a Second Language classes for adults 18 and over are conducted by the Literacy Volunteers of Monmouth County at the Red Bank Public Library. The **Jersey Inchkins** is a club for adults who do "very little work." Club members build houses, rooms, scenes, and vignettes in miniature, usually on a scale of one inch to one foot. They meet at the Library on the third Wednesday of each month from 1:00 to 3:30 p.m. The group welcomes new members 18 and older interested in developing their skills in this creative field.

Readin' on the River, our adult book discussion group, meets the third Wednesday of every month from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m. Contact the Library for more information about the book of the month and to register.

The River Read Poetry Reading Series meets on the second Saturday of each month from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. except in January 2017 when they will meet on 1/7. Sessions include featured readers and openmic time. The public is invited and the programs are free. Come listen...come share. No registration required.

Yarn Arts is a group of like-minded crafters who knit and crochet. They meet to work on individual projects on the first Thursday of each month from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m. and the third Thursday from 3:00 to 4:00 p.m. All ages are welcome to join in, whether experienced or novice. This program is free and no registration is required.

Yoga for Adults meets every Friday from 1:30 to 2:30 p.m. The class is appropriate for all levels of yoga experience. Please bring your own yoga mat. First come, first served. Limit of 20 people age 18 and over.

Our **Chess Club** is open to all ages. Join us on Thursday evenings at 6:45 p.m. RBR Chess Team members will challenge you and give you tips to improve your game. Or, perhaps, you can teach them a thing or two!



Throughout the year we will be celebrating our 80th Anniversary with fun family programs with a historic twist. A **Vintage Valentine Craft Party** in February and a **Dairy Program** (with ice cream making!) in June are just a couple of examples.
